

OSHA Penalties Increased January 11, 2024



OSHA's maximum penalties for serious and other-than-serious violations increased from \$15,625 per violation to \$16,131 per violation. The maximum penalty for willful or repeated violations will increase from \$156,259 per violation to \$161,323 per violation. States that operate State Plans for worker safety must increase state penalties to amounts at least equal to Federal OSHA's penalties.

The penalties are aimed at maintaining their deterrent effect and improving the effectiveness of civil monetary penalties. The updated penalt amounts are"

1. Serious Violations:

- Minimum Penalty: \$1,190 per violation
- Maximum Penalty: \$16,131 per violation

2. Other-Than-Serious Violations:

- Minimum Penalty: \$0 per violation
- Maximum Penalty: \$16,131 per violation

3. Willful or Repeated Violations:

- o Minimum Penalty: \$11,524 per violation
- Maximum Penalty: \$161,323 per violation

4. Posting Requirements Violations:

- Minimum Penalty: \$0 per violation
- o Maximum Penalty: \$16,131 per violation

5. Failure to Abate Violations:

 Penalty: \$16,131 per day unabated beyond the abatement date (generally limited to 30 days maximum)

For repeated other-than-serious violations that would otherwise have no initial penalty, a graduated penalty structure applies¹ These adjustments ensure that employers are aware of the consequences and encourage compliance with safety regulations.

Remember, workplace safety is crucial, and adherence to OSHA/WISHA guidelines helps protect workers and prevent accidents. The cost of compliance with workplace safety regulations pales in comparison to the cost of non-compliance.
